Dear Carrollton Parents and Guardians,

Recent events in surrounding communities and across the U.S. are weighing heavy on all of our hearts and minds. We have been working with the Carroll County Sheriff's Department to do everything we can to provide a safe environment for our students and staff members. We will continue to work together in developing safety protocols as well as addressing the mental health issues and identifying children in crisis.

Our school safety plans have been written and evaluated in coordination with the Carroll County Sheriff's Office, local police, the FBI and the Department of Homeland Security. Buildings have been modified, technology added, and safety tests performed. These plans are mandated by state law and are law enforcement sensitive for the protection of our schools. We will continue to work together to identify and develop additional resources and actively participate in discussions about other security measures.

We need your help too. Please talk with your children about the importance of telling an adult or authorities if they see or hear something that causes them concern for fellow students, teachers, staff or their school. Students and adults can also call or text the safety tip line at 844-SAFER-OH (844-723-3764). Our students are the first and best line of defense in preventing school tragedies. We also ask that if you have firearms in your home, you should take every measure to ensure that they are secured so that they are not accessible to children.

Remind your children of the dangers associated with social media and how to use it properly. Our Sheriff's department has zero tolerance for anyone sharing disturbing messages of potential harm on social media or any other public means: this includes reposting, forwarding or sharing information with others.

Lastly, if your child is experiencing any trauma or other concerns, please let your school principal know. The school district has access to resources that can help. We also have resources posted online in the "Crisis Help" section that is available 24/7.

Together, we can work to ensure that our students are in a safe and secure learning environment.
